



Support Program for Speakers from the CMDO Network for Scientific Events in the Province of Quebec

Created in April 2012 by the Fonds de Recherche du Québec - Santé (FRQS), the **Research Network on Cardiometabolic Health, Diabetes and Obesity** aims to develop research excellence in these areas, to transfer knowledge and to foster the use of new knowledge so as to promote quality of life for all Quebecers.

The network is launching its support program for the invitation of guest speakers which are regular members of the CMDO Network for the year 2019 - 2020. This program aims to encourage any scientific event (congresses/symposiums) in Quebec province to invite as a lecturer or guest speaker researchers regular members of CMDO. Ultimately, the participation of CMDO members in various events aligned or not with the CMDO themes will increase the dissemination of CMDO research and expertise, increase the decompartmentalization of scientific themes and encourage the emergence of new multidisciplinary teams. As a result, any Quebec researcher may apply for financial support through this program, provided that the conference is conducted by a regular CMDO member and is linked to one of the areas of the CMDO Network: cardiometabolic health, diabetes and/or obesity. The number of awards will be determined based on the funding envelope for speaker support for each of the two annual competitions. The eligibility criteria and method of evaluation are described below. Funding of \$ 500 or \$ 750 per grant (up to 2 awards per event) will be awarded for events demonstrating excellent scientific quality, influence and structuring effect for research within the network.

Applications that are late, incomplete or that do not meet the eligibility criteria will not be evaluated. Scientific events for which award(s) will be granted will have to take place within the period specified for each competition.

Deadlines for applications are the following:

- 1) February 10 of each year, for scientific events taking place from next April to October.
- 2) <u>September 10 of each year</u>, for scientific events taking place from next **November to** March.

Eligibility:

- 1. The scientific event must be held in the province of Quebec.
- 2. The scientific event does not necessarily need to have a general focus in relation to the research topics of the CMDO. On the other hand, a section of the event must address CMDO themes (at least *the presentation of the guest speaker associated with the award*).





- 3. The person responsible for the application is a Quebec researcher involved in the organization of the scientific event mentioned.
- 4. The guest speaker must be a regular member of the CMDO Network.
- 5. The invited speaker must present research results related to the research topics of the CMDO Network.
- 6. Financial support for invited speakers are awarded within the framework of Scientific Days / Congresses / Symposia (eg with guest speakers, presentations of researchers / students, poster sessions, etc.).
- 7. Departmental conferences are not eligible (eg a one-hour conference by a researcher invited by a department, followed by a visit of the research center).
- 8. Maximum amount awarded:
 - a. \$750 Guest speaker from another city (50km or more between the conference site and the guest speaker's affiliation)
 - b. \$500 Local guest speaker (less than 50km between the conference site and the guest speaker's affiliation)

Methods of application for the support of a scientific event by the network:

The scientific event leader (a Quebec researcher) applies by filling out an electronic form on the network's website (online, see below) including:

- 1) The name, the location and dates of the scientific event;
- 2) A brief description of the nature of the event and its target audience;
- 3) Approximate number of participants;
- 4) Are there one or more students and patient-partners on your organizing committee?
- 5) A justification of the relevance for the network to support the event in relation to its missions.
- 6) The number of grants requested (maximum 2 awards per event);
- 7) The name and affiliation of the guest speaker(s) and his/her link to the event;
- 8) Title of the presentation;
- 9) Selection of the amount requested (\$ 500 (less than 50Km) or \$ 750 (more than 50km));
- 10) Detailed budget description (*Use of \$ 500 or \$ 750*);

Evaluation of applications:

The evaluation of the applications (i.e. scientific events in Quebec) will be made by the network's direction committee after initial evaluation and recommendation by the executive committee according to the criteria mentioned above. The results will be communicated to the selected candidates before the period determined according to the date of application to the competition.

Award, visibility and administration:





The amounts awarded will be forwarded to the institution or organization sponsoring the event and may be used for any legitimate expenses for the organization of the scientific event. A report on the use of funds must be provided by March 31 following the event.

The support of the CMDO Network should be mentioned in the program of the event. The network will also display the list of sponsored events on its website.

WARNING:

- To save your application to complete it later, you must click the *Finish Later* icon (a username will be requested, as well as a password), then quit by closing the program.
- If you have saved your application and click on *Exit and clear your answers*, <u>all</u> saved data will be erased.

Name of the person in charge of the application (CMDO regular member): max. 100 characters

Email address of the person in charge: max. 100 characters

Affiliation of the person in charge: max. 120 characters

Name of the scientific event: max. 250 characters

Location of the event: *max. 250 characters*

Date(s) of the event (eg. December 15-17, 2013): max. 50 characters

Brief description of the nature of the event: max. 1250 characters





Target audience: max. 256 characters

An approximate number of participants expected: max. 100 characters

Description of the type of presentations (oral, posters) and number of presentations (guest speakers, researchers, students, by category and total): max. 300 characters

The academic levels of participants: Choose one or more responses from the following: MSc, PhD, resident (s), postdoctoral fellow or other

Are there one or more students on your organizing committee? If yes, how many and please name at least one? max. 300 characters

Are there one or more patient-partners on your organizing committee? If yes, how many and please name at least one? max. 300 characters

A justification of the relevance of the scientific event to the network's mission (i.e. why should the network support the scientific event): max. 1250 characters

The number of grants requested (maximum 2 awards per event): Choose 1 or 2.

Name of guest speaker (s): max. 70 characters, including spaces

Speaker's affiliation: max. 120 characters including spaces

Link of the speaker with the event: max. 1250 characters including spaces

Title of the lecture: max. 300 characters including spaces

Detailed budget description (Use of \$ 500 or \$ 750): max. 250 characters including spaces
