



Call for PhD students, residents and postdoctoral fellows: Support for international meeting – iCEPS Conference 2020: Preventing and Treating Pain with Non-Pharmacological Interventions

Created in April 2012 by the Fond de Recherche du Quebec – Santé (FRQ-S), the **Research Network on CardioMetabolic health, Diabetes and Obesity** aims to promote research excellence, knowledge development and knowledge sharing in these areas to improve the quality of life of Quebecers.

The network launches a call to PhD students, residents and postdoctoral fellows to enter the contest – *iCEPS Conference 2020 : Preventing and Treating Pain with Non-Pharmacological Interventions* a scientific meeting to be held from **March 19 to 20, 2020 at Toulouse, France** (*conference website <u>https://www.iceps2020.com/</u>). Doctoral students, residents and postdoctoral fellows from all regular members of the network are invited to participate in this contest. Selected candidates must make an oral or poster presentation (<i>determined by the organization of the congress*). The objective of the conference is to promote good practices in non-pharmacological interventions, share evidence of efficacy, safety and cost-effectiveness, discuss evaluation methods, better understand their mechanisms of action as well as facilitating interactions especially between speakers (internationally renowned researchers) and young researchers. iCEPS will assume conference registration costs (*accommodation not included*) for one Quebec participants selected. The CMDO Network will refund up to \$ 750 to the participant for the transportation and accomodations costs (*these fees are to be paid by the participant*). <u>All other costs</u> shall be borne by the participant and / or its director.

The deadline for submission of applications is <u>November 13, 2019</u>.

The eligibility criteria and the method of evaluation are described below. Applications submitted late, incomplete or which do not meet the eligibility criteria will not be evaluated. Selected applicants will be contacted in **November**.

Eligibility criteria:

1) Being a doctoral student, a resident or a postdoctoral fellow, whose director is a <u>regular</u> <u>member</u> of CMDO Network. The supervisor must be a member of <u>before</u> applying to the competition;

2) Working on research project linked with cardio metabolic health, diabetes and / or obesity.

3) Excellence and involvement: Possess excellent academic records





4) Demonstrate motivation to pursue a career in research in a thematic area of CardioMetabolic Health, Diabetes and Obesity Network.

5) Speak and understand French and English (conferences and discussions are bilingual).

6) Selected candidate must submit a scientific abstract to the congress to be held from March 19 to 20, 2020 at Toulouse, France (**submission deadline: December 1**st, **2019**)

7) Note that a student / trainee may be winner for this contest only once.

Materials required for submission:

1) Contest nomination form – *iCEPS Conference 2020: Preventing and Treating Pain with Non-Pharmacological Interventions* completed online (see below).

2) A support letter from the supervisor (*this letter may be integrated directly in the form or communicated by email to the network at <u>concours@rrcmdo.ca</u>)*

3) Curriculum vitae, FRQS format (*with detailed Contributions section*) of the candidate. Send that document to the network at <u>concours@rrcmdo.ca</u>.

Applications assessment process:

The executive committee of the network will evaluate all applications submitted. The competition results will be announced in **November**.

The participant must provide a description of the reasons to participate in the *iCEPS conference 2020* in connection with his career plans (Justification of the relevance of your participation (dissemination, knowledge transfer, etc.)).

The supervisor must provide a support letter for applicant participation in the conference (and state financial support to cover the expenses not reimbursed by the conference or CMDO Network) (The letter can be integrated directly in the form or communicated (in PDF format) by email to the network <u>concours@rrcmdo.ca</u>. If this is the case, please indicate this in the text box). max. 4000 characters including spaces.
