

Guest Speaker Invitation Support Program (from outside Quebec or regular CMDO members)

Created in April 2012 by the Fonds de Recherche du Québec - Santé (FRQS), the **Research Network on CardioMetabolic health, Diabetes and Obesity** aims to Pursue the development of research in cardiometabolic health, diabetes and obesity, translate and mobilize knowledge to promote sustainable health among Quebecers.

The network is launching its **Guest Speaker Invitation Support Program** for the year **2024 – 2025** (two annual competitions). The program invites researchers who are regular members of the network to seek financial support so as to invite speakers from outside Quebec or a regular member of the CMDO Network in a context of a Quebec-based scientific event which they are organising and that is related to cardiometabolic health, diabetes and obesity. The eligibility criteria and evaluation procedures are described below. Events demonstrating excellent scientific quality, major outreach opportunities and a structuring effect on research within the network will be funded up to \$1,000 per speaker from outside Quebec, or up to \$500 per speaker who is a regular member of the CMDO (maximum of 2 speakers per event).

Scientific events for which award(s) will be granted will have to take place within the period specified for each competition.

Deadlines for applications are the following:

- 1) **February 10 of each year**, for scientific events taking place in the following months from **April to October**.
- 2) **September 10 of each year**, for scientific events taking place in the following months from **November to March**.

Women, Aboriginal people, visible minorities, ethnic minorities, people with disabilities and people from the 2SLGBTQIA+ community are encouraged to apply for funding. For evaluation purposes, we strive to recruit a diverse committee that reflects the profiles of the applicants and ensure an evaluation process that takes into account the particular situations of the applicants, including atypical trajectories.

Applications that are late, incomplete or that do not meet the eligibility criteria will not be evaluated.

Eligibility criteria:

1. The application must be headed by a researcher who is a regular member of the network.
2. The guest speaker (for which the grant is requested) must have research activities that are related to the research theme of the CMDO network.

3. The guest speaker support grants must be used in the context of a standard Scientific Event/Congress/Symposium (e.g. with guest speakers, presentations by researchers/students, poster session, etc.).
4. Departmental conferences are not eligible (e.g. a one-hour lecture by a researcher invited by a department, followed by a tour of the research center).

How to apply to request guest speaker support for a scientific event:

The researcher in charge of the scientific event (who is a regular member of the network) can apply by completing an online application form available on the network's website (see below):

1. The name of the scientific event, location and when it will take place;
2. A brief description of the nature of the event and its target audience;
3. The approximate number of participants expected;
4. The number of grants requested (maximum of 2 per scientific event);
5. The name(s) of the guest speaker(s), their affiliations, and a brief description of their expertise and scientific notoriety/outreach;
6. A detailed budget description;
 - up to \$500 to invite a regular CMDO member;
 - up to \$1,000 to invite a speaker from outside Quebec;
7. Are there one or more students and patient-partners on your organizing committee?
8. A justification of the relevance of the scientific event to the network's missions (i.e. why should the network support the scientific event);
9. Describe the EDI vision of your activity.

Evaluation of applications:

The evaluation of applications (e.g. Quebec scientific events) will be done by the steering committee of the network after an initial evaluation and recommendation of the executive committee according to the criteria mentioned above. In the event of a large number of applications, priority will be given to inviting speakers from outside Quebec. The results will be communicated to selected candidates before the determined period for each competition.

Terms of delivery, visibility and administration:

The amount granted will be sent to the institution or organization sponsoring the event. The support of the CMDO Network must be mentioned in the event program. The network will also post the list of sponsored events on its website.
