



Presentation Award Program for Quebec Scientific Event

Created in April 2012 by the Fonds de Recherche du Québec – secteur Santé (FRQ), the mission of the **CardioMetabolic Health**, **Diabetes and Obesity Research Network** is to pursue the development of research into metabolic and cardiovascular health, diabetes and obesity, and to transfer and mobilize knowledge to promote sustainable health among Quebecers.

The network is launching its **Presentation Award Program for students, residents and postdoctoral fellows for the year 2025 - 2026**. The program invites researchers who are regular members of the network and who are organizing a scientific event in Quebec to seek financial support so as to offer presentation awards to students, residents and postdoctoral fellows who are presenting their research related to cardiometabolic health, diabetes and/or obesity in the context of the scientific event. Fifteen presentation award grants will be offered among all applications received for each of the two annual competitions. The eligibility criteria and method of evaluation are described below. Events demonstrating excellent scientific quality, major outreach opportunities and a structuring effect on research within the network will be funded up to \$500 per presentation award. There is no maximum number of awards that can be requested per scientific event. However, the evaluation committee reserves the right to determine the final number of awards allocated for the event.

Scientific events for which award(s) will be granted will have to take place within the period specified for each competition.

Deadlines for applications are the following:

- 1) February 10 of each year, for scientific events taking place in the following months from April to October.
- 2) <u>September 10 of each year</u>, for scientific events taking place in the following months from **November to March**.

Women, Aboriginal people, visible minorities, ethnic minorities, people with disabilities and people from the 2SLBGTQIA+ community are encouraged to apply for funding. For evaluation purposes, we strive to recruit a diverse committee that reflects the profiles of the applicants and ensure an evaluation process that takes into account the particular situations of the applicants, including atypical trajectories.

Applications that are late, incomplete or that do not meet the eligibility criteria will not be evaluated.

Eligibility Criteria:

In connection with the scientific events:

1. The presentation awards must be granted in the context of a standard Scientific Event/Congress/Symposium (e.g. with guest speakers, presentations by researchers/students, poster session, etc.).





In connection with the applicants:

1. The application must be headed by a researcher who is a regular member of the network.

In connection with the presentation award winners:

- 1. Students (including MSc and PhD), residents and postdoctoral fellows are eligible. Awardees and their supervisors must become members of the network if they are not already members.
- 2. Presentation awards (for oral or poster presentations) must be given for the scientific event for which the application was successful (i.e. awards cannot be transferred to another scientific event).
- 3. The research projects of awardees must be related to the research themes of the CMDO network.

How to apply to request presentation award support for a scientific event:

The researcher in charge of the scientific event (a regular member of the network) can apply by completing an online application form available on the network's website (see below):

- 1. The name of the scientific event, location and when it will take place;
- 2. A brief description of the nature of the event and its target audience;
- 3. The approximate number of participants expected;
- 4. A description of the type (oral, poster) and of the number of presentations by the students, as well as their academic level (MSc, PhD, professional, post-doctorate);
- 5. A description of how student presentations will be evaluated (e.g. Explain 1) how prices will be awarded and 2) that prices will be awarded only for presentations related to the CMDO research themes);
- 6. The number of awards requested (there is no maximum);
- 7. Are there one or more students and patient-partners on your organizing committee?
- 8. A justification of the relevance of the scientific event to the network's missions (e.g. why should the network support the scientific event);
- 9. Describe the EDI vision of your activity.

Evaluation of applications:

All applications are evaluated by a Scientific Committee. Any member with a conflict of interest is excluded from the final decision. If necessary, an external committee may be formed to carry out the evaluation. The results of the competition will be announced in the weeks following the application deadline and before the fixed period of the activity.

Terms of delivery, visibility and administration:

The amount covering the presentation awards will be sent to the institution or organization sponsoring the event. The support of the CMDO Network must be mentioned in the event program and during the presentation award ceremony. If appropriate, prices can be awarded by a network representative. The network will also post the list of awardees and sponsored events on its website.
